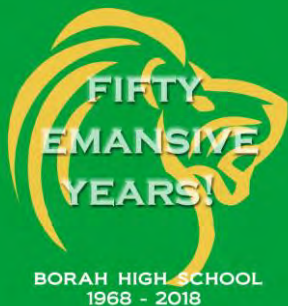

The Borah Class of 1968 celebrates its 50th reunion this weekend knowing it is helping another generation of Borah students. Raising more than \$35,000 from 45 classmates through the Boise Public Schools Education Foundation, Borah's Class of 1968 has been the only class in the Treasure Valley to have endowed a scholarship.

Already the endowment has supported three students with \$1,000 scholarships, paid directly to an accredited non-profit college, community college, or university in Idaho for tuition and fees. The Borah recipient, selected by a committee of Borah teachers and counselors, must be a full-time student who demonstrates outstanding citizenship, a commitment to study and education, and a high likelihood of completing post-secondary education.

We realize what we have been able to accomplish in life has been thanks, in part, to those who believed in us, encouraged us, and challenged us. The Borah Class of 1968 is paying it forward in one small but mighty Borah Lion way, forever.

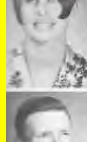
